Sunday, September 2, 2018

Text: Ecclesiastes 3:1

“To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven:”

Text: Ecclesiastes 3:5-6

In times of peace, stones were cleared from the fields, allowing for cultivation. In wartime, the rocks were thrown on the fields to make them unusable (2 Kings 3:19, 25). Text: Ecclesiastes 3:7
